



The 2003 Washburn University Football Media Guide is intended to provide information for writers, broadcasters, sports editors, sports information personnel and fans who follow the Ichabods. Material in the guide was current as of the printing deadline of July 7, 2003. Additional information is available in the Washburn Sports Information Office and through weekly releases available to personnel from accredited media outlets covering the Ichabods.

Washburn University is in Topeka, Kan., at the intersection of 21st Street and Washburn Avenue. Yager Stadium at Moore Bowl is located west of the Petro Allied Health Center in the center of campus. Media parking is located on the north and south sides of the bowl.

The Washburn University Sports Information Office is located in room No. 200 D-E of the Petro Allied Health Center. Office hours are from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m., Monday through Friday. Phone: 785.231.1010 x1791; Fax: 785.231.1091. You may e-mail the SID office at gene.cassell@washburn.edu.

Media Credentials are available to personnel from accredited media outlets by contacting Gene Cassell, sports information director, Washburn University, Topeka, Kansas 66621. Credentials are available 90 minutes prior to kickoff at the Will Call window at the northwest entrance of Yager Stadium. All media seating is in the Bianchino Pavilion on the west side of Yager Stadium on

the third level. Press box space is reserved on a game-by-game basis and space is limited. Please contact the Sports Information Office at least one week before the game date to ensure a seat in the press box.

Radio Stations wishing to broadcast from Yager Stadium should make broadcast requests through the Sports Information Office at least one week in advance. One courtesy line will be made available to the official station of each visiting team. Additional stations wishing to broadcast must install their own line.

Telephone lines for writers to file their stories are available in Bianchino Pavilion. There are plenty of telephone lines for writers to file stories and photographers to wire photos.

Media Services include a game program and lineups, plus statistics and game notes for each team. Halftime stats are provided as well as individual and team stats and a play-by-play summary. Statistics are kept on the Automated Scorebook computer system by MRR Systems. Refreshments are available



before each game.

Postgame Interviews with Coach Craig Schurig are available to media personnel after his brief meeting with the team immediately following the game. Players will be brought, by request, to the press box or gathered on the field for interviews. Interviews during the week can be arranged by calling the Sports Information Office.



Washburn University was established in February 1865 as Lincoln College by a charter issued by the State of Kansas and the General Association of Congregational Ministers and Churches of Kansas. A two-story brick building on the northeast corner of 10th and Jackson Streets was soon erected and the first classes began in January 1866. In 1868, the school was renamed Washburn College, in recognition of a \$25,000 donation by Ichabod Washburn, a church deacon and resident of Worcester, Mass.

The university was granted a permanent location in 1865 when Topekan Col. John Ritchie donated a 160-acre site, which at the time was a considerable distance southwest of the city. Construction on the first building began in 1872, with occupancy taking place in 1874. For the next two decades, college President Peter McVicar conducted an aggressive development campaign. His efforts resulted in the establishment of numerous Victorian limestone structures which characterized the campus for the next 90 years.

Expansion of the school was constant. The School of Law was organized in 1903, as was a School of Fine Arts and a medical school, which educated physicians until 1913. During the next three decades structures such as the Mulvane Art Museum, Benton Hall and Whiting Field House were added to the campus. In June 1966, a tornado struck Topeka and several historic buildings on campus were demolished. The Washburn community rallied and financial support from friends and alumni made possible the rebuilding of many school facilities during the coming years. Today, university facilities offer more than one million square feet of modern academic and support space.

In 1941, the citizens of Topeka



endorsed Washburn by voting to establish a municipal university, supported in part by the city and governed by a local board of regents. In 1952, the Washburn Board of Regents officially changed the name of the school to Washburn University of Topeka. In 1999, the university's primary funding was moved from city property tax to county sales tax sources, with the school retaining status as a municipal subdivision of the state. In addition to local financial support, Washburn has received state funds since 1961, which have been coordinated by the Kansas Board of Regents since 1991. Washburn is governed by its own nine member Board of Regents.

Washburn provides broadly-based liberal arts and professional education through more than 190 certificate, associate, baccalaureate, master's and juris doctor programs through the College of Arts and Sciences and the Schools of Law, Business, Nursing and Applied Studies. Ninety-seven percent of the faculty hold a doctorate or the highest degree available in their discipline.

Loren Ferre' Athletics Director



Loren Ferre' became Washburn's director of athletics in February of 1996 after a six-year appointment at Black Hills State University in Spearfish, S.D. Ferre' is a dynamic leader who has implemented many internal changes within the athletic department since arriving on campus. He has put increasing scholarships and departmental fund-raising at the top of his list.

At Washburn, Ferre' has been instrumental in the establishment of a strong Ichabod Club support team and the raising of funds for athletic scholarships.

While at BHSU, Ferre' was also director of the Donald E. Young Sports Fitness Center, a 172,000 square foot, \$10.2 million facility. During his Black Hills tenure, the athletics department nearly tripled its outside revenue, including large increases in ticket sales and scholarship funding. All 10 varsity teams won a conference title in his final three years.

Before joining the staff at Black Hills State, Ferre' spent 17 years at the University of North Texas. He was the director of the Coliseum (1987-90) was the associate and assistant director since 1980. He held the post of event coordinator (1978-80).

Ferre' is a 1971 graduate of Texas Christian University, earning a bachelor of arts degree. He earned a master's in journalism from North Texas in 1982, and is currently finishing his doctorate at North Texas.

Ferre' is the NCAA Division II Men's Basketball South Central Regional Chairman serving his second year on the committee last season.

Ferre' and his wife Sarah, have two daughters, Caitlin and Hope, and reside in Topeka.

For the first time since 1966 when a tornado devastated the Washburn campus destroying several buildings, including the Moore Bowl press box, a major renovation has taken place upgrading the Icabod football facility.

The \$4.3 million construction project began following the 2002 football season. A new press box, president's level, hospitality lounge and booster area will reshape the scenery around the football field. Additional changes include new restroom facilities, concession stands and a viewing point at the north end of the field which will include an Icabod statue, memorial walkway and donor's plaques.

The new name of Yager Stadium at Moore Bowl is in honor of former Icabod runningback Gary Yager. An anonymous donor pledged \$1 million. The first lead gift to the stadium renovation was from former Icabod defensive end Bernie Bianchino who donated \$500,000 for the Bianchino Pavilion which will house six suites, a president's suite, media facilities, new restroom and concession facilities and meeting rooms.

Moore Bowl has served as the home for Washburn football since its dedication on Sept. 28, 1928 - a 20-12 loss to William Jewel. Throughout its 73-year history, the bowl has been witness to hundreds of high school and college games,

long-standing conference rivalries and the tornado of 1966.

Construction of the original bowl was part of a \$215,000 athletic project, which also included the addition of Whiting Field House to the Washburn campus. The bowl was built in a natural depression south of Old Thomas Gymnasium and was designed to be similar to the facility at the University of Colorado. By taking advantage of the natural depression, the bowl was constructed in just seven months at a cost of approximately \$30,000. The construction work was under the direction of Cleveland S. Loper, head of the engineering department, with the contract for the excavation given to C.A. Ritchie of Topeka.

The original design for the horseshoe-shaped bowl (overall size of 400' by 650') called for 15,000 seats - 8,000 in the original construction with the remaining seats to be built along the north end of the horseshoe. Additional seating was not added and the bowl currently has a seating capacity of 7,200. A press box and concessions stands were added to the facility in 1963 but destroyed three years later in the '66 tornado.

The bowl was named in honor of George Godfrey Moore, a Topeka sports enthusiast who had developed a reputation throughout the Midwest as a keen sportsman and friend of Washburn.

Gary Yager

Gary Yager, a native of Kansas City, Mo., and current vice chairman and director of Western National Bank and Unison Bancorp, Inc., was a member of the Ichabods from 1972-75 and rushed for 1,297 yards and 12 touchdowns in his career. Yager came to Washburn and to the Ichabod football program because of the athletic scholarship he received coming out of East High School.

His rushing total ranks 11th all-time in the Washburn career charts, leaving school as the fifth leading ground-gainer in Ichabod history. His most successful season came during his senior campaign when he rushed for 748 yards and eight touchdowns en route to First team All-Great Plains Athletic Conference honors. The eight touchdowns were the second most in school history in a single-season and that total still ranks in the top six all-time while the 748 yards is ninth on the all-time chart.

Upon his graduation from Washburn in 1976 with a bachelor of business, Yager remained in Topeka taking a position at the First National Bank of Topeka as the assistant vice president of correspondent banking - a position he held for 10 years before moving to Commerce Bank & Trust Company as the vice president of loans. While at Commerce Bank & Trust, he managed a \$34,000,000 loan portfolio.

Yager has remained close to Washburn and to the Ichabod football program. He served on the recent search committee for the Ichabod head coach and is currently a member of the Football Stadium Renovation Committee helping to fund-raise for the project working as an integral part of getting the Topeka corporate and banking communities involved. He is also past president and treasurer of the Sigma Phi Epsilon Alumni Chapter.

Other positions he has been elected to is the vice chairman of the Topeka Housing Authority.

Staying active and dedicated to the Topeka and Washburn communities are two of the reasons that compelled the donor to honor Yager with the stadium gift.

Yager is married to former Washburn student athlete Widge Swartz. At Washburn Widge participated in both volleyball and gymnastics. The Yagers have two sons, Tyson and Tab.





WEIGHT ROOM

After more than \$150,000 in upgrades to the weight room, the Washburn athletic program now boasts one of the best facilities in the Midwest.

Ichabod Power is based on using free weights and the feet in contact with the floor, using triple extension of the ankle, knee and hip. This type of training is used to develop athletes stability in the joints and trunk, and power in the lower body when in contact with the playing surface. Each multi-rack and Olympic platform allows the Washburn athlete to perform Olympic Lifts on a solid oak surface.

The multi-racks are self-contained with all the weight on the rack. This allows the Washburn athlete to perform 90 to 95 percent of their work in one area. The racks and platforms have special features that allow the student-athlete to perform secondary exercises with special attachments. The installation of new equipment transformed Washburn's weight room into a top notch facility.



TRAINING ROOM

The Washburn Athletic Training Center is one of the most advanced in the Midwest. The four-year old facility is nearly triple the size than the one it replaced.



Joining Ice's staff this season will be assistant John Burns, who will also teach in the Health and Physical Education Department.

Dr. Iris Gonzalez, the campus physician, is the team's resident doctor. Dr. Matthew Bohm of the Cotton O'Neil Clinic comes to campus every Wednesday to evaluate student-athletes and to educate athletic trainers. Orthopedic Clinic and Sports Medicine provides state-of-the-art orthopedic care. The clinic has a team of five surgeons, a physical assistant, registered nurses, a physical therapist and certified athletic trainers. Stormont-Vail's Gerald Applehans, Director of Physical Medicine, provides Michael Ramirez, ATC-R, for daily treatments, education and internship sites.



A new era in Washburn football began when Craig Schurig was named head coach of the Ichabod football program Dec. 28, 2001.

After one season as the Ichabods' head coach, Schurig has already made his mark at Washburn defeating arch-rival Emporia State in the final game in Moore Bowl snapping an 11-game losing streak to the Hornets.

After coaching for nearly a decade in a winning program, Schurig has brought the knowledge of success, a winning attitude and a new intensity to the Ichabod football program.




Brown, a native of Liberal, Kan., is a 1997 graduate of



The Trenton, Mo., native and his wife, Karen, were married June 16, 2001.









Don't let the 3-8 record from last season mislead you. The Ichabods saw continued improvement throughout last season, winning three of their last six games. The team plans to build on last year's successes and give fans an even better 2003.

The Ichabods are returning 36 lettermen from last season's 3-8 squad and eight starters on offense and defense are back after head coach Craig Schurig's first year at the helm of the Washburn program.

"Last season we had a lot of new faces in the lineup," Schurig said. "Those new faces gained a lot of experience and playing time last season, and with that game experience they picked up, we believe it will help us this season and in years to come."

The Ichabods had 18 true freshmen play last season and those freshmen are a year older and stronger thanks to the more than \$150,000 of improvement in the weight room.

"The entire team has bought into our program," Schurig said. "From the way they conduct themselves in the weight room, to the classroom and to the field, we have a total team effort and everyone is heading the direction that we as a coaching staff want to go - a winning program on and off the field."

The Offense

The Washburn offense returns eight starters from last season's squad that recorded 3,972 yards in total offense, the fifth highest single-season total in school history. The majority of that was through the air where the 'Bods passed for 2,447 yards - the fourth single-season total in school history.

The Ichabods averaged 25.4 points per game in 2002, which was sixth in the MIAA. However, the Ichabods averaged 30 points per game in their last six contests.

"We learned an entirely new system and as the season went along, our offense improved as they grasped the offense," Schurig said.

Quarterbacks

The Ichabods will have a pair of experienced juniors battling for the starting quarterback position in Dustin Hickel and Tyler Schuerman.

Hickel (left) started the final 10 games last season and passed for 2,160 yards and 21 touchdowns completing 46 percent of his passes.

Schuerman returns after being injured on the first play of the season against Wisconsin-La Crosse. As a sophomore, Schuerman passed for 1,034 yards and rushed for 477 more and led the Ichabods in total offense with 188 per game appearing in eight games.

"Having two experienced quarterbacks in a good problem to have," Schurig said. "No matter who starts, we will have a game-tested quarterback to lead the offense and the team has confidence in both quarterbacks."

Also seeing time at quarterback last season was sophomore Cason Lehman. Lehman passed for 246 yards and three touchdowns last year. Lehman is versatile and his athletic ability allowed him to also line up at running back and wide receiver last season.

Receivers

The Ichabod receiving corps received a lot of experience last season with four of the top five receivers last season being either true freshman

or redshirt freshmen. The 2002 MIAA Freshman of the Year Sam Sissom (left) exploded on the scene grabbing 12 touchdown receptions and 719 yards, setting new freshman records in each category. Senior DaWight Benning tied Sissom with 41 receptions on the season and had 617 receiving yards and six touchdowns. Sophomore Mike Odupitan averaged 21.9 yards per reception and gained 394 yards in nine games with four touchdowns. Lehman, when not throwing the ball or running it, had 360 reception yards and 18 catches with one touchdown and tight end Jeff Scott had 11 catches for 77 yards as a true freshman.

"Our receivers are still young in game experience with the returning freshmen and DaWight playing his first full year after redshirting at Oklahoma a couple of years ago," Schurig said. "But they are a talented group and defenses will not be able to look for one receiver over the other because we do have depth and skill, which is something we want to have in all of our positions."

Offensive Backfield

The Ichabods will have plenty of competition at running back as many as 10 different 'Bods are looking for starting positions.

Seniors Chris Huelsman (left) and Darryl Humphrey rushed for 222 and 121 yards respectively. Huelsman started last season in the receiver rotation, but switched back to his native running back slot toward the end of the season.

Redshirt freshman Trent Hearn had a tremendous spring practice and broke camp as the No. 1 tailback. Hearn rushed for 3,100 yards his junior and senior seasons at Lancaster High School in Texas and 46 touchdowns.

Also looking for carries will be redshirt freshmen Chris Brown, Brett Dubert and Chris McCann.

Other newcomers looking for repetitions will be transfer Jeff Womack from Dodge City Community College and incoming freshman A. J. Patterson.

Womack rushed for 2,300 yards and 26 touchdowns his final two seasons in high school in Riviera Beach Fla., and Patterson was Topeka's offensive player of the year rushing for 1,977 yards and 19 touchdowns as a senior finishing his prep career with 3,817 yards.


"We have the depth in the backfield to create great competition for carries and playing time," Schurig said. "This depth is something that we want to create in all positions on the playing field."

At fullback, sophomore Rawshawn Bland enters the fall as the No. 1 fullback and redshirt freshman Chris Brown is behind him on the depth chart. Bland rushed for 113 yards and one touchdown last season. Also returning at fullback will be junior Kip Kraisinger who missed last season after suffering a knee injury.

Offense Line

The Ichabods' offensive line has four starters returning from last season headed by second team All-MIAA pick Tim Watts. Last season Watts played left tackle, but this season he is moving to right tackle.

Joining Watts is junior Matt Durler at right guard and senior Kevin Pierce at center - both of whom started all 11 games last season on the offensive line. Senior John McKinley will start at left guard, a position,





where he started five games.

Transfer Tyrone Barrett joined the Ichabods last spring at will anchor the line at left tackle.

Also looking for playing time will be sophomore tackle Jim Holland who played in nine games, juniors Adam Toby and Ben Thursby. Redshirt freshman Pat Mack will also provide depth on the offensive line.

"The first unit has experience as well as members of the second line," Schurig said. "And overall we are stronger and will look to be more physical up front and the line's work in the off-season will lead us to that goal."


The Defense

The defense allowed nearly 42 points per game in the first seven outings of the season, but over the last four, the Ichabods improved allowing only 20, including the first shutout in 36 games in a 49-0 win over Missouri-Rolla.

The Ichabods now have a full year under its belt with the 4-4 defensive alignment and with eight starters returning and solid group of those who saw playing time last season, the defense should be improved.


The Ichabods were 10th in scoring defense, pass defense, rush defense and total defense.

"The returning players have valuable experience that will help us improve game by game this season," Schurig said. "We have better athletes on defense than we had last season, and we have more depth to increase competition at all positions."



Defensive Line

The Ichabod defensive line has three of four starters returning with senior defensive end Jacob Barth (left) and defensive tackle Eric Taylor. Taylor is moving from defensive end to the line's interior where he will join junior nose guard Bryce Kelley. Also returning is sophomore defensive end Terell Cobb who started the final five games as a true freshman.




New to the mix will be University of Oklahoma transfer Blake Nichols. Nichols red-shirted last season for the Sooners. Junior Bo Kobuszewski is moving

from linebacker to defensive end and will provide extra depth on the line.

"In this scheme, the front line is vital to the success of the rest of the defense," Schurig said. "They have to penetrate and control the line of scrimmage."

Linebackers

The linebackers may be the most experienced group of returnees for the defense with all four starters returning. At outside linebacker, sophomore Josh Looney and senior Brooks Myers (left) return. Myers finished fourth on the Ichabods with 88 tackles and Looney recorded 62.




On the inside, senior Morgan Dewey and sophomore Grant Gould accounted for 185 tackles last season with Gould tallying 93 and Dewey 92.

"In this defensive scheme, the linebackers should be in a position to lead the team in tackles as they are very run oriented," Schurig said.

The Ichabods have a pair of linebackers returning after injuries in seniors Brian Peel and Jeff Wimpy. As a junior at Washburn, Wimpy recorded 48 tackles.

Secondary

The Ichabods have two starters in the defensive backfield returning in a pair of seniors - senior cornerback Darold Smith (right) and junior free safety Joe Corcoran (left). Smith led the MIAA in passes defended with 16 including four interceptions, tying for the team lead with Corcoran. Corcoran led the MIAA in tackles with 124, the third highest single season total in school history.



Sophomore Mark Jackson, a redshirt freshman Tramaine Young and Henry Talley will all battle for the other starting cornerback position. Jackson played in 10 games last season. Young is a transfer from Northeastern Oklahoma A&M.

"Our cornerbacks and safeties will continue to be active against the run, but they will need to improve their fundamentals in pass coverage," Schurig said.

Special Teams

The Ichabods special teams will have the newest faces of any other part of the team this season as they are without a returning starter.

First team All-MIAA and honorable mention All-America punter Eric Roth spent his four years rewriting the Ichabods' punting records, so this season, the punting and the placekicker positions are wide-open.

Freshman Connor Sabel and Derek Banion will battle for placekicking duties and freshmen Ben Boswell, Joe Sample and Sabel along with red-shirt freshman Adam Azeltine will all compete for the punting duties.

"We will be young with our kicking game," Schurig said. "But we have excellent candidates and will have good competition for these duties."

Etc.

The Ichabods have nearly 100 student athletes preparing for fall camp, which is the most numbers in many years for the Washburn football program. These numbers will add to team depth and add to the competition of playing time between each position.

This season also marks the start of a new era with the opening of Yager Stadium at Moore Bowl. After a \$4.25 million improvement and renovation, the team, campus and community are excited to start the 2003 season.

"We are looking forward to not only playing in the new facility, but we want to put a product on the field that will be worthy of our new stadium," Schurig said.

The Story Behind Mr. Ichabod

The name "Ichabod" was derived from the first name of Ichabod Washburn, an early benefactor of the university. Ichabod Washburn was born in Kingston, Mass., on Aug. 11, 1798.


In 1831, he began what was his life work - and the pride of Worcester, Mass., - when he essayed the drawing of wire. He was co-founder of Washburn and Moen Manufacturing (later American Steel and Wire).

His own lack of formal education made him acutely aware of its importance. When approached by the residents of Topeka to help save the ailing Lincoln College, Ichabod Washburn responded with a \$25,000 gift. In May, 1869, Lincoln College was renamed Washburn College in recognition of his outstanding contribution.


Until 1938, there was no graphic representation or any particular characteristics associated

with the mascot. During the 1937-38 school year, the editors of the KAW yearbook decided that such items were important to the university and began to accept suggestions for a design of Mr. Ichabod. The adopted design was drawn by Bradbury Thompson (BA '34).

The following explanatory material accompanied the first representation of an Ichabod in the KAW: "He has courage and enthusiasm as shown by his brisk walk. He is democratic and courteous, for he tips his hat as he passes. Sincere in his search for truth and knowledge, he studiously carries a book under his arm. His friendly smile makes you like him. He is neatly dressed and he fits well into his generation ... but adopts himself with equal ease to any change in life.

'Bods win 3 of last 6 games under new coach, program and attitude

The 2002 edition of the Washburn Ichabod football team was a list of firsts and lasts over the 11-game schedule in which the Ichabods finished 3-8 under first-year head coach Craig Schurig.

After starting the last season in Moore Bowl with a tough loss to Wisconsin-La Crosse, in which the Ichabods lost three starters to various injuries, Washburn continually improved throughout the rest of the season to win three of its last six games.

The first win of the season for the Ichabods and Schurig came on Oct. 12 against Truman State in Kirksville. The Ichabods gained some revenge for 2001 when the Bulldogs beat Washburn on homecoming 27-26, on a last second 47-yard field goal.

The Ichabods defeated the Bulldogs 26-21 and it was the first win for Washburn in Kirksville in school history.

"It was great to get that first win," Schurig said. "It was important to this program, these players and our staff to get it because everyone had worked so hard."

The biggest of the three wins came in 10 Ichabod senior's final game in Moore Bowl Nov. 2 against arch-rival and No. 16 ranked Emporia State 34-21. The win was the first over the Hornets snapped an 11-game slide to Emporia State.

"We knew this was going into the Emporia State game, that it was going to be a great day for Washburn athletics and the whole university," said head coach Craig Schurig.

Coming off the big win over Emporia State, the Ichabod defense posted a shutout in a 49-0 white-washing over Missouri-Rolla on the road. The shutout was the first for the Ichabods in 36 games, last coming in a 36-0 win over Southwest Baptist on Oct. 14, 1999.

"The shutout was really great," Schurig said. "When you look back at our defense improved from week one against La Crosse to the Missouri-Rolla game and even to the Southwest Baptist game, by the end our defense made tremendous strides and we expect that same improvement to carry into the 2003 season."

Even though the Ichabods opened the season with five straight losses, the team stayed together and bought into the program the coaching staff was implementing.

During the 2002 season, the Ichabods did have some outstanding single-game and season outings breaking several school records.

- Senior punter Eric Roth broke the single-season school record for average with a 42.5 clip eclipsing the previous mark of 42.0 by Brent Cripps recorded in 1977. Roth finished his career fourth on both the all-time career chart with an average of 38.2 and total yardage list with 7,800 yards.

- 2002 MIAA Freshman of the Year Sam Sissom broke several school records including most receiving touchdowns by a freshman in a season with 12. The freshman record for a season was three, and Sissom had three in a single game on two separate occasions against Missouri Western and Missouri Southern. His 719 receiving yards also set a new freshman record. He also became the first freshman since Michael Dritlein in 1992 to lead the team in receiving.

- Sophomore quarterback Dustin Hickel snapped the sophomore record for passing yards in a season with 2,160 while falling two touchdown passes short of tying the school record of 23. Hickel also accounted for 28 total offensive touchdowns setting a new record and his 2,571 total offensive yards was the second highest in school history.

- Senior punt returner Patrick Hayes finished his career with 51 kick returns tying the school record and his 23.3 yards per kick return places him third on the all-time chart. Hayes recorded these stats playing in parts of three seasons and missing 10 games as a senior after suffering a knee injury.

- Senior returner Corey Crain is the only Ichabod in the last 17 seasons to return a kickoff for a touchdown joining Ed Vacek, finishing second on the career kickoff return chart with a 24.6 average.





Topeka - Sept. 7 - The Washburn Ichabods opened the 2002 season with a 31-17 loss in its 1,000th game in school history.

The Ichabods' junior quarterback Tyler Schuerman was injured on the first play of the game. To open the 2001 season, Schuerman injured his knee on the sixth play of the season against Wisconsin-La Crosse.

The Ichabods jumped out to a 3-0 lead on freshman Aaron DeKosky's 36-yard field goal with 11:22 left in the first half. That score was set up by Andrew Mocado's fumble on the Eagles' first play of scrimmage after taking a hard hit from senior cornerback Corey Crain. Junior Morgan Dewey recovered to set up the initial score of the game.

The Eagles would then score the next 17 points on a pair of touchdown passes of 77- and 64-yards and a 46-yard field goal.

Junior wideout DaWight Benning and sophomore Dustin Hickel would then hook up on a 55-yard touchdown pass with 1:53 left in the second quarter. The Eagles would then score another touchdown pass right before the half.



Neither team would score in the third quarter. The Ichabods would start the fourth quarter with a punt block for a touchdown. Freshman Bobby Nelson blocked the punt and junior Brooks Myers recovered it in the endzone to cut the Eagles led to 24-17. The Eagles would add another score to push the margin to 14.

On defense, sophomore Joe Corcoran led the Ichabods with 11 tackles. Nelson had nine tackles and a forced fumble to go with his blocked punt and Dewey also had nine including 2 tackles for loss.

Senior punter Eric Roth had nine punts for 395 yards including a 63-yard attempt on his first punt of the season.

Brooks Myers picked up a blocked Eagles' punt in the endzone in the Ichabods' first game of the 2002 season.

The Ichabods opened the scoring with a 9-yard touchdown pass from sophomore Dustin Hickel to freshman Sam Sissom capping a 72-yard, eight play drive. However the Tigers would come back before the first quarter ended to tied the score at seven. Washburn picked up its first win of the season and Craig Schurig landed his first win as a head coach in the 'Bods 26-21 win over Truman State. The loss avenged the Bulldogs win over the Ichabods in last season's homecoming game in Moore Bowl.

The Ichabods jumped on the scoreboard first taking advantage of a Bulldog turnover as DaWight Benning ran the reverse for a 34-yard touchdown run. However the Bulldogs would score on the ensuing possession and take the lead 7-6.

The Bulldogs would close out the scoring in the first half on the first play of the second quarter and take a 14-6 lead into the lockers at halftime.







It all came on the day when Washburn had groundbreaking on a new stadium facility at halftime. It was also senior day as eight Ichabods played their final game in Topeka.

The Ichabods did not waste any time jumping ahead of the Hornets on a 67-yard touchdown pass from Dustin Hickel to Mike Odupitan on their first drive of the game. However, the Hornets would take their ensuing drive and march 46 yards on seven plays to knot the score at seven.

The Ichabods would take their next drive and travel 87 yards in 11 plays capped by a Cason Lehman 1-yard touchdown plunge. After pinning the Hornets in their own endzone and forced them to punt, the snap went over the punters head for a safety.

The Ichabods would score again on Sam Sissom's 11th touchdown reception of the season - a 13-yard pass from Hickel.

With 3:24 left in the second quarter, the Hornets would cut the lead to eight at 22-14 on a touchdown run by Tad Hatfield.

After the break, the Ichabods would again score with 7:52 left in the third on a 20-yard touchdown pass from Hickel to Dawight Benning capping a 7-play, 60-yard drive. After the Hornets scored with 2:22 left in the third, the Ichabods would finish the scoring on Hickel's 3-yard scamper for a touchdown to push the score to 34-21.

Hickel would finish the game 12 of 27 passing for 240 yards and three touchdowns while

rushing for another score. Odupitan led the 'Bods receiving corps with 113 yards on three receptions while Sissom had four catches for 33 yards and Benning had four for 90 yards.

On defense, the Ichabods forced four Hornet turnovers. Darold Smith had a forced fumble, fumble recovery and an interception to go along with 10 tackles - eight of those solo stops. He also had three pass break ups as well. Joe Corcoran had 12 tackles and an interception and Morgan Dewey had 10 tackles for the 'Bods.

Joe Corcoran had this interception and 12 tackles against ESU in the 'Bods' 34-21 win.

Washburn Ichabod Football


Rolla - Nov. 9 - The Washburn Ichabod defense stonewalled the Miner attack while the Ichabod offense rolled to its highest output of the season in a 49-0 win over Missouri-Rolla. The shutout was the first for the Ichabods since Oct 14, 1999, when the 'Bods shut out Southwest Baptist 36-0 in Bolivar - a span of 36 games.

The Ichabod defense set the tone on the Miners' first possession as on their fourth play from scrimmage, the Ichabods' Grant Gould forced a UMR fumble on the Miners' 33 yard line. Six plays later, WU quarterback Dustin Hickel scampered nine yards for the 'Bods first touchdown.

On the Miners' next series, the Ichabod defense forced another fumble and the Ichabod offense scored another touchdown on Rawshawn Bland's 1-yard touchdown plunge - a two point conversion out of the swinging gate by Cason Lehman put the Ichabods up 15-0.

DaWight Benning rushed for four yards on the fourth play of the second quarter to push the score to 21-0. In the third quarter, freshman Sam Sissom recorded his 12th touchdown reception of the season on a 29-yard touchdown pass from Hickel. The Ichabods would then score 14 points in 20 seconds to end the third quarter to go up 42-0. The first score was a 37-yard touchdown run by Hickel and the second was a 11-yard reverse run by Marcus Miller. Al DeLeon would finish out the scoring for the Ichabods with 13 seconds left in the game on an 8-yard run.

The Ichabods racked up 612 total yards in offense while holding the Miners to 310. Of the 'Bods 612 yards, 361 of them came on the ground - 21 short of the school record set against McPherson in 1995. The 612 yards was 59 yards short of the school record for total offense in a game. The Ichabods tallied 681 against Rockhurst in 1949. The Ichabods also recorded 31 first downs, two short of the school record of 33 set against Emporia State in 1998.



Hickel led the Ichabod rushing attack with 89 yards and the two rushing touchdowns while DeLeon had eight carries for 84 yards. Hickel passed for 220 yards and one touchdown pass. Hickel recorded overall 319 yards of total offense in three quarters of work as he was relieved by Cason Lehman who finished 4 of 6 for 31 yards. Lehman also had three carries for 27 yards.

Sissom had 72 yards receiving with three catches and the one touchdown.

On defense, the Ichabods were led by Brooks Myers who had eight tackles, a forced fumble and a pass breakup. The Ichabods Joe Corcoran, J.R. Phillips and Corey Crain each had interceptions for the Ichabods as the defense forced five Miner turnovers.

Dustin Hickel averaged 11 yards a carry and passed for 220 yards and one touchdown with 319 yards in total offense in a 49-0 win over UMR.


The Bearcats would score the next two touchdowns to go up 26-13. Hickel would throw another touchdown pass to DaWight Benning to cut the lead 26-20 with 29 seconds left in the game. The attempt to recover the onside kick failed and SBU would take a knee and run out the clock.

Hickel finished the game with 136 yards passing with two touchdowns. He also ran for 18 yards on 10 carries and one touchdown.

The Mid-America Intercollegiate Athletics Association, a 10-member conference of NCAA Division II institutions in Missouri and Kansas, was first organized in 1912 as the Missouri Intercollegiate Athletic Association.

Over the past 15 years, the league has undergone several changes, highlighted by expansion and increased participation in national championships.

The MIAA has gained the reputation of being one of the top NCAA Division II conferences in the nation. MIAA student-athletes have won 11 national championships and more than 100 individual national titles.

The MIAA currently conducts conference championships in eight men's and eight women's sports.

Men's champions are crowned in football, cross country, basketball, indoor and outdoor track and field, baseball, tennis, and golf. Women's champions are determined in volleyball, cross country, soccer, basketball, indoor and outdoor track and field, softball and tennis.

Ralph McFillen was named to succeed Ken B. Jones as commissioner of the MIAA in January 1997, and took over in July of that year. He formerly served as commissioner of the Metro and Gulf South conferences.

Matt Newbery, formerly an assistant sports information director at Pittsburg State University, joined the conference in July 1994 as director of sports information.

College Football Comes to Washburn in 1885



"Fifty years ago the Washburn college students organized the first college football team in the state. A young Englishman, who worked in the Santa Fe shops, brought with him from the old country an enthusiasm for the Rugby game. He organized a Santa Fe football team and challenged the Washburn students to organize and play. We accepted the challenge, organized a team and beat him. We then induced other colleges in the state to get into the field, and until after I graduated Washburn college our team was unbeaten on the football field. As I recollect, the first defeat was suffered at Columbia, Mo., in 1890." - By Robert Stone - Topeka-Journal

Back in 1885, when there were no paved streets in Topeka, and "MacVicar" was the name of the Washburn president and not one of those unpaved streets, an Englishman brought football to the Washburn campus.

Six years later, in 1891, the Ichabod football tradition entered a new era as Washburn played its first season of intercollegiate competition. According to Washburn records, there were no games played in 1895, allowing the 1991 squad to celebrate the 100th season in Washburn football history.

Washburn celebrated the 50th anniversary of football's debut on campus in 1935. Robert Stone, a member of the team in 1885, penned a brief sketch of the first 50 years of Washburn football which appeared in the Oct. 30, 1935 issue of the Topeka Journal.

Washburn Conference Ties

Throughout its athletic history, Washburn has looked beyond the state borders of Kansas to find conference affiliations. The university has competed in nine different conferences, including its current association with the Mid-America Intercollegiate Athletics Association (MIAA), a NCAA Division II league of institutions in Missouri and Kansas.

Washburn's longest association was with the Central Intercollegiate Conference, of which the Ichabods were members from 1941 to 1968. Like the MIAA, the CIC included institutions in Missouri and Kansas.

Membership in three conferences were more regional in nature, forcing the Ichabods to travel throughout five states. The Missouri Valley Conference consisted of schools in Nebraska, Kansas, Oklahoma, Iowa and Missouri, many of whom are currently NCAA Division I member institutions. Both the Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference and the Great Plains Athletic Conference put the Ichabods on the road to Colorado, Utah, New Mexico, Nebraska and Kansas.

Washburn has won two outright conference championships, while earning co-championships four times. The Ichabods were Central Conference co-champions in 1931. They held the title of Central Intercollegiate Conference co-champions in 1949, 1953, and 1954.

In 1964, Washburn won its first outright championship by claiming the Central Intercollegiate Conference title. Washburn's most recent conference crown was won in 1983 as members of the Central States Intercollegiate Conference.

Did the Ichabods throw the first forward pass?

When an athlete or team accomplishes a "first" these days, all America can witness as modern technology is capable of bringing it into our living rooms. Firsts which happened decades ago, like who threw the first forward pass, are a little less clear.

Many schools – Washburn included – claim to have thrown the first forward pass. Whether Washburn did or not depends on how the implementation of the rule is viewed.

Records indicate the first forward pass rule was written by Navy coach Paul Dashiell and became a legal part of the game in 1906. Any forward pass thrown before the official rule would be illegal, and in the researcher's opinion, not a historical first. Accepting that view prohibits one from believing that the first forward pass was thrown during either a Yale-Princeton game in 1876 or a North Carolina-Georgia game in 1895, as various documents show.

According to Pat Harmon, historian at the National College Football Hall of Fame, the first legal collegiate forward pass was thrown by St. Louis University during a Sept. 5, 1906 game against Carroll College.

So we have illegal forward passes before the 1906 rule, and legal forward passes after the rule. But what about a pass thrown during a game designed to test proposed rules changes? That is where Washburn's claim comes into play. If you believe a "first" can happen during a game testing proposed rules, then Washburn is correct in claiming it threw the first forward pass.

The Capper/MRI Quick-Fact Book of Kansas states on page 15: "The first forward pass in football history was thrown in December, 1905, in a football game between Washburn University and Fairmount College."

An article in the Oct. 30, 1935, edition of the *Topeka Journal*, titled "Washburn played Game 30 years ago testing new grid rules suggested," reports: "Washburn was in the football spotlight Christmas Day in 1905 when the Ichabods played a postseason game with Fairmount in Wichita to test the proposed rules changes. It was known as the Walter Camp game."

The *Kansas Historical Quarterly* published an article named "Evans: College Football in Kansas," which quotes Bliss Isley, who played in the 1905 game: "The first forward pass in history was thrown that afternoon by Bill Davis to Art Solter and was good for a 10-yard gain."

The article goes on to say "Isley said the pass delivery was primitive. Davis heaved the ball with both hands like a basketball player shooting a free throw and wobbled through the air."

From these sources, the researcher concludes Washburn did indeed throw the first forward pass on Christmas Day in 1905 during a game to test a new set of rules. The game in question was not the regular season contest listed in this media guide – in which Washburn prevailed 10-6 – but rather a scoreless tie that is not listed in the 1905 scores.




